Pravda o tancích: Jak NATO lhalo svou cestu ke katastrofě na Ukrajině

Tanková válka se vyvinula. Velké obrněné bitvy, které byly charakteristickým znakem velké části druhé světové války, arabsko-izraelských konfliktů, které sloužily jako základ operační doktríny pro NATO i Sovětský svaz (a které byly v plném rozsahu implementovány Spojenými státy během operace Pouštní bouře v roce 1991) již proběhl.

Stejně jako většina vojenských technologických inovací byla schopnost přežít moderní hlavní bitevní tank překonána nasazením obranných systémů určených k překonání takové obrany. Pokud by se moderní vojenská síla pokusila zahájit rozsáhlý útok s převahou tanků proti dobře vybavenému protivníkovi na stejné úrovni vyzbrojenému moderními protitankovými střelami, výsledkem by byla rozhodující porážka pro útočící stranu poznamenanou <u>kouřícími hromotluky. vyhořelé nádrže.</u>

Nechápejte mě špatně: tanky stále hrají zásadní roli na moderním bojišti. Jejich status mobilního bunkru je neocenitelný v druhu opotřebovacích konfliktů mlýnků na maso, které definovaly současnou fázi rozsáhlých pozemních bojů. Rychlost a pancéřování stále přispívají k přežití a hlavní dělo tanku zůstává jednou z nejsmrtelnějších zbraní na moderním bojišti.


Moderní tank však nejlépe funguje jako součást kombinovaného týmu zbraní, podporovaného pěchotou (namontovanou i nesenou) a velkým množstvím podpůrných zbraní (dělostřelectvo a vzdušná podpora.) Jako součást takového týmu, zvláště dobře vycvičeného. v umění boje zblízka <u>zůstává tank základní válečnou zbraní</u>. Pokud je však tank provozován izolovaně, je prostě drahá mobilní rakev. Hodně se udělalo o nedávném rozhodnutí NATO a spojeneckých států poskytnout Ukrajině hlavní bojové tanky Západu. Politika tohoto rozhodnutí je samostatným tématem. Tento článek se bude zabývat operačními praktickými aspekty tohoto rozhodnutí, konkrétně tím, zda byla vojenská schopnost Ukrajiny posílena poskytnutím těchto nových zbraňových systémů.

K zodpovězení této otázky je třeba prozkoumat tři základní otázky: školení, udržitelnost logistiky a provozní zaměstnanost.

Výcvik

Výcvik základního člena americké posádky M1 Abrams trvá 22 týdnů. Tento výcvik jen dává vojákovi velmi základní sadu dovedností, aby byl funkční. Skutečné operační odbornosti lze dosáhnout pouze během měsíců, ne-li let, dodatečného výcviku nejen v samotném systému, ale také jeho zaměstnáváním jako součást podobně

vyškoleného týmu kombinačních zbraní. Jednoduše řečeno, ani ukrajinská tanková posádka, která má zkušenosti s provozem tanků T-72 nebo T-64 ze sovětské éry, nebude schopna okamžitě přejít na hlavní bojový tank západního typu.

Za prvé a především, velikost posádky tanku ze sovětské éry je tři, což odráží skutečnost, že sovětské tanky využívají automatický nakládací mechanismus. Západní tanky mají čtyři členy posádky, protože nabíjení děla hlavního tanku se provádí ručně. Přizpůsobení se této dynamice vyžaduje čas a vyžaduje rozsáhlý trénink.

Školení je drahé. NATO v současné době poskytuje Ukrajině tři typy západních hlavních bojových tanků: britský Challenger 2, německý Leopard 2 a americký M1A2. Neexistuje žádný jednotný <u>školicí kurz</u> – každý tank vyžaduje svůj vlastní jedinečný prospekt školení, který nelze přímo převést na jiný systém.

Decentralizované tréninkové procesy vytvořené tímto různorodým přístupem podporují neefektivitu a generují nesrovnalosti ve výsledcích – jedna posádka nebude jako druhá, což je v boji, kde se předpokládá, že jednotky jsou zaměnitelné, aby podporovaly předvídatelné výsledky, pokud všechny ostatní okolnosti zůstanou stejné, obvykle fatální.

Tyto problémy navíc jen posílí důraz, který bude kladen na rychlé výsledky. Realita je taková, že jakýkoli výcvikový program, který vyvinuly a dodaly státy poskytující tanky, nebude pro tento úkol dostačující, což vede k tomu, že špatně vycvičené posádky berou extrémně komplikované zbraňové systémy do nejnebezpečnějšího prostředí na světě pro tank – zuby tanku. Ruská armáda navržená a vybavená k zabíjení těchto stejných tanků.

Logistická udržitelnost

Tanky patří mezi technicky nejnáročnější zbraňové systémy na moderním bojišti. Neustále se porouchají, zvláště pokud nejsou správně udržovány. U M1 Abrams jsou na každou hodinu, kdy je tank na poli, potřeba tři hodiny údržby. Tento problém se v boji jen zvětšuje.

Normálně je obrněná jednotka vybavena vysoce specializovanými posádkami organické údržby, které dokážou opravit většinu drobných problémů, které mohou tank odstavit. Vzhledem k požadavkům na školení pro výrobu této úrovně vysoce kvalitního mechanika je nepravděpodobné, že Ukrajina bude mít tento druh podpory údržby.



Ukrajinský dělostřelec hází prázdnou 155mm nábojnici, zatímco ukrajinští vojáci 23. listopadu 2022 střílí z houfnice M777 směrem k ruským pozicím na frontě východní Ukrajiny.

To znamená, že tanky, které jsou poskytovány Ukrajině, budou muset být vráceny zemím NATO pro jakékoli významné opravy zařízení, které je poškozeno prostým používáním nebo skutečným bojem. Stručně řečeno, je vysoce pravděpodobné, že západní hlavní bitevní tank v ukrajinských rukou se v určitém okamžiku během jeho operačního použití Ukrajinou porouchá, což znamená, že celkový počet tanků, které má Ukrajina k dispozici, bude mnohem menší než počet poskytnutých tanků.

Provozní zaměstnání

Vrchní velitel ukrajinských ozbrojených sil, generál Valerij Zalužnyi, řekl *The Economist* minulý měsíc, že potřebuje 300 tanků, 500 bojových vozidel pěchoty a 500 děl, pokud má mít nějakou šanci porazit [Rusko].

Po setkání Ramstein Contact Group dne 20. ledna a následných následných diskusích o poskytování tanků se NATO a jeho spojenečtí partneři dohodli poskytnout méně než 50 % požadovaného počtu tanků, tedy méně než 50 % celkového počtu tanků. požadovaných bojových vozidel pěchoty a méně než 20 % požadovaného dělostřelectva.

Kromě toho je harmonogram dodávek tohoto zařízení nesouvisle rozložen na období, které se táhne na mnoho měsíců a v některých případech se prodlužuje až do příštího roku. Nejenže to komplikuje otázky školení a logistické udržitelnosti, které jsou pro Ukrajinu již tak nepříznivě nakloněny, ale je téměř nemožné začlenit tento materiál do soudržného operačního plánu zaměstnanosti. Stručně řečeno, Ukrajina bude nucena nasadit poskytnuté vybavení – zejména tanky – do boje po částech.

Pravdou o tancích je, že <u>NATO a jeho spojenecké státy dělají</u> <u>Ukrajinu slabší</u>, nikoli silnější, tím, že jí poskytují vojenské systémy, které jsou příliš složité na provoz, mimořádně obtížné na údržbu a které nelze přežít, pokud nejsou používány přesvědčivým způsobem a podporovány rozsáhlí partneři v kombinovaných zbraních. Rozhodnutí poskytnout Ukrajině hlavní západní bojové tanky je doslova sebevražedný pakt, něco, co by ti, kdo tvrdí, že hledí na nejlepší zájmy Ukrajiny, měli zvážit, než bude příliš pozdě. 

It's just not practical to armor the entire tank. Also, as much larger 120mm and 125mm tank guns appeared over the last few decades, the massive gun blast can knock out or even kill nearby infantrymen. The tank/infantry team from World War II is no more.

It's called 'armour' but the armour on the tank is not even remotely worth the cost. At best it restricts the elevation and turning speed of the main turret, actively making your fighting vehicle worse at its primary role.

Tanks are probably worth more deployed on the battlefield rather than torn down for scrap.

Probably.

Building a new one is flatly insane.

There was vaguely an argument for tanks before guided artillery existed. Now you can kill a tank with a laser pointer, and it costs less than 1% of what the tank cost even if you miss the first shot. You don't have to breach cover or even directly risk the laser – use a periscope.

Yes, please field as many tanks as possible, thanks in advance. They're great for our army's morale.

If you're restricted to using the RPG and its evolutions for some reason, then yes a tank without an infantry screen is a sitting duck, and a tank with an infantry screen is surrounded by soft targets for you to play with. E.g. a tank will probably resist a "saturation" barrage from unguided artillery, but none of its buddies will. E.g. if your tanker has popped the hatch so they can see more than nothing, then you can snipe the groundhog who might spot your RPG ambush.

Remember they are hardened against ATGs to some extent, so shoot twice. It will still cost 0.1% of what the tank cost.

Sure you want big guns mixed into your infantry platoons, but they should be artillery that happens to be able to fire at a flat arc. Trying to harden the artillery against direct hits is nothing but a waste of money and especially fuel.

Tanks are designed with a heavily armored frontal arc, but modern missiles and drones can strike from above, the sides, or rear.

If the enemy has them. It is the Ukrainians that have fancy antitank missiles.

Drone still have to be pretty powerful to take out a tank. Ukrainians have only taken out tanks with their hobby drones when the hatches were open. They seem able to disable a BMP but not a tank.

I don't deny the golden age of the tank is over but the Ukrainians are in a position to take advantage of them for what could be the last time. Russia isn't well equipped with anti-tank guns and built their military under the assumption of air power.

A single tank can also do an incredible amount of siege damage before it is taken out. An M1 can stay pretty far back and just lob shells at an enemy emplacement.

It's just not practical to armor the entire tank. Also, as much larger 120mm and 125mm tank guns appeared over the last few decades, the massive gun blast can knock out or even kill nearby infantrymen. The tank/infantry team from World War II is no more.

Yea I think fast striking vehicles with enough armor to shield from small arms make more sense. If they are destroyed then oh well. They don't cost millions to make. The other problem with the tank is that the operators have to come out at some point. They're also still vulnerable to molotovs and liquid attacks that blind them. Infantry traditionally protects them from such attacks but drones make that difficult.

By the end of WW2 both sides were pretty good at taking out tanks in urban areas. The panzerfaust was so simple yet very effective in urban combat.
