

Ženy častěji než muži...

- identifikovat se jako necisgender (13 % respondentů, 9 % mužů) - identifikovat se jako neheterosexuální (30 % žen, 17 % mužů)

- vystudovat společenské vědy (37 % vs. 16 %) nebo zdravotní vědy (13 % vs. 5 %); a

méně pravděpodobné, že budete v přírodních vědách (22 % vs. 45 %) nebo v podnikání (16 % vs. 24 %)

- identifikujte se jako člen Demokratické strany (44 % vs. 22 % a je méně pravděpodobné, že se ztotožníte s některou z ostatní strany)

-štíhlý liberál (kde 1 = velmi liberální, 5 = velmi konzervativní; ženy M = 2,51, SD = 1,19; muži M = 3,11)




Figure 2. Respondents' likelihood of considering viewpoints they disagree with when thinking about various






Figure 7. Respondents' perceptions that people who express offensive views are causing harm.



To nám umožňuje testovat stereotypy elitních vysokých škol vs. neelitních vysokých škol.

Je překvapivé, že ze 13 vysokých škol UW má Madison druhé nejnižší procento studentů, kteří se identifikují jako "necisgender" a nejméně žádných odpovědí. (Všimněte si, že Madisonův vzorek o velikosti asi 1100 je docela robustní: to je dost velké pro prezidentské volby.) To je v rozporu se stereotypem, že transmánie infikuje pouze privilegované děti z vyšší střední třídy, jako jsou studenti UW-Madison. Místo toho bylo nejvyšší procento studentů, kteří tvrdili, že nejsou cisgender, na městské UW-Milwaukee a vzdálené UW-Superior poblíž Duluth.




